Dear Parents,

First Holy Communion

If your child is in Year 4, 5 or 6 and you would like them to make their First Holy Communion next summer, information about the preparation sessions will be sent out shortly. The week began with an assembly focus about Kindness. The children then worked on various projects in their classes over the course of the week. Parking

We still have a few parents who do not follow our parking rules and come down to the front of school at the end of each day.
