Weather

Well we have certainly had winter weather this week. When the playground is icy we bring the children into the hall in the mornings. We check the playgrounds before children go out during the day. This week we have had times when all playtime has had to be inside, or we've used parts of playgrounds to get the children outside. It is impractical to grit areas as large as the playgrounds.

If and when we get snow we will let children out if they are suitably dressed with warm winter coats, hats, gloves and wellies or snow boots. If they are in school shoes they will have to stay inside as wet feet and socks will make them uncomfortable during the day. On Thursday we went onto the field as the surface was crunchy and dry rather than icy and the children had a great time running off some energy.

Uniform

Staff have been reminding children to take responsibility for their uniform appearance. Missing ties, shirts hanging out and non-uniform PE kit are being challenged in an age appropriate way.

Year 2 Assembly

This was a real treat this morning. Year 2 shared their work on Catholic Social Teaching for Peace. They shared drama, art, singing and signing and gave us all some super messages about how to share God's peace with the world. In March it will be Year 4s turn to do a class assembly.

Pick up

A small number of parents routinely flout our pick up procedures. This is not fair on those that follow them and is not a good example to set the children. Parking at the front at the end of the day is for:


- Pre School pick up and the cars have to be gone before 3pm
- Blue badge holders if the designated spaces are full
- Exceptional circumstances agreed in advance with myself

Being five minutes or so late every day is not a valid reason to park at the front of school. Children who are late being picked up will go to Night Owls half hour line which will incur a cost. Staff have meetings and work to complete after school each day and cannot spend time in the foyer waiting. On occasion a parent will ring regarding an unforseen issue and we will make arrangements for that child as a one off but for some children it is almost every day, which is unfair on them and our staff.
