Pope Francis

Although Pope Francis had been ill for some time and looked incredibly frail on Easter Sunday, the news of his death still came as a shock. This week we have sought to follow Bishop Mark's advice by praying for Pope Francis as he so often asked us to. Before Mass on Wednesday the staff shared a short reflection and prayer time with their classes and throughout the week we have taken opportunities to remember Pope Francis and pray for him.

This morning we held an assembly and talked about Pope Francis' life and mission. We touched on his legacy too and drew connections with this half term's Catholic Social Teaching Principle of "Community and Participation."

Altar Servers

Lent Fundraising

I don't yet have the final figure for our Lent fundraising but I hope to be able to share this with you next week. Thank you so much for your generosity.

School Building Fund

Each year we ask for £15 per child to support the Diocese Building Fund. This fund finances important projects in school buildings across the diocese. In recent years we have benefited from it with a playground resurfacing, major improvements to our roof, fencing around the car park, new fencing around Pre School and a new boiler for the Pre School and Reception classrooms. We have also had all the pavements to the front of school replaced. Last year we had all the old windows and doors surrounding the courtyard replaced and had the Pre School and Reception class radiators replaced. Last year our main school boiler was also replaced. As a school we have to contribute around £3000 each year to the fund for these projects. In the past we have received enough contributions through the building fund to cover this but in the last few years contributions have reduced and last year we only received £700. If you are able to pay the Building Fund levy of £15 you can find it on School Gateway. We as a school get so much out of the fund for the relatively small amount we are asked to contribute. Please help if you can.

Night Owls Bookings

Please make sure you book your children in to Night Owls well in advance. You also risk there not being sufficient staff and your request being rejected.
